SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

SLAS was founded on August 26, 2003 by former Congressman Mr. Robert Livingston. He knew that Americans and other foreign nationals would not only be dealing with China more and more in the future, but also would most likely living and working in China as well. He recognized the need to provide an American-style education for the children who would be moving with their parents to China. The main concern for expatriates is that their children don't fall behind in their education, due to the parents' choice to move to China for business. Therefore, Mr. Livingston knew that by providing the same system and quality of education as home, he would eliminate their worry and, thereby, further relations between China and the U.S.

The surrounding community is comprised of a mixture of traditional middle-class Chinese citizens and upper-class expatriate families, particularly Korean and Japanese, residing and working in Shanghai. Our student body reflects the upper-class expatriate families because we are an international school and are not allowed by law to accept any local Chinese students. Initially, we expected the majority of our students to be native English speakers, but this is not the case. Over time we tailored our curriculum according to the needs of our students and we implemented a very strong, successful English Language Development (ELD) program. SLAS is a small school and as our student body increases we are continually evolving to address our students' educational and personal needs.

SCHOOL ACADEMIC FACILITIES

The first priority of Shanghai Livingston American School is student safety and well-being. Every effort is taken to ensure the environment is conducive to the healthy physical and emotional growth of each student. Furniture and equipment are pre-inspected for hazards.

Our outdoor facilities include a track, tennis court, soccer field, basketball courts, 2 playgrounds and a greenhouse. Our indoor facilities include Elementary and Secondary school libraries, 2 art rooms, 1 pottery class, a technology classroom with an interactive Smart Board, 2 computer labs (including 19 iPads), a fine arts wing, science lab, and 2 indoor play areas. Each year our Facilities Improvement Committee makes a positive impact to create an optimal studying environment.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Thirty credits are required for graduating with an Advanced Diploma, twenty-seven for a SLAS diploma. One credit is earned for each full year of passing work in a course in grades 9-12. Specific credit requirements include the following:

CURRICULUM

Shanghai Livingston American School offers a comprehensive curriculum based on the California Common Core Standards. Each school division utilizes teaching methods and theory culled from leading experts in the fields of education, psychology, and social science. The majority of our teachers are licensed in the United States and many also possess advanced degrees in education.

The secondary program provides a solid college preparatory program in which students are encouraged and challenged to grow academically, individually, and as world citizens. Students select courses from a variety of academic disciplines including English, social studies, mathematics, science, foreign languages, art, music, technology, computer science, physical education, and health.

GRADING SYSTEM

Shanghai Livingston American School measures progress in four marking periods each year. The semester grade is considered the final grade for each semester. Students receive two semester grades for year-long courses. To recognize the extra effort put into AP and Pre AP courses, SLAS awards an extra 0.5 point toward each Pre AP course and an additional 0.75 for each AP course in which a student earns a class grade of at least 70%. This weighted credit is reflected in a student's grade point average, not in the course grade itself.

Grade point averages (GPAs) are calculated by averaging the total quality points earned for all courses. excluding credit transferred to SLAS from other schools. Quality points are awarded as indicated below:

ADMISSIONS

All students sit for placement exams. SLAS is not equipped or staffed to educate students with sever learning disabilities. SLAS enrolls students without regard to gender, race, creed, national origin and religious belief. Chinese nationals must obtain permission from the Shanghai Education Committee before they are allowed to enroll at SLAS.

WHAT MAKES SLAS SPECIAL

Shanghai Livingston American School is a small family oriented school where every student gets the individual attention they deserve. From small class sizes to a variety of diploma options including part time students and an accelerated program, SLAS caters to the needs of its families.

CALENDAR AND SCHEDULE

The school year is divided into two semesters, the first from August to December and the second from January to June. Under a modified block schedule, there are alternating days of four periods of instruction with a duration of 90 minutes for each class.

ACADEMIC ADVISING AND COLLEGE COUNSELING

SLAS employs 2 full time academic/quidance counselors to assist students with decision making and planning from admission to graduation. The Director of Guidance meets with families and students to create and maintain a successful academic career at SLAS and beyond.
